Dr. Marie Gdalevitch completed both her medical and orthopedic surgery degrees at McGill University. Following her residency, Dr. Gdalevitch pursued her first fellowship in limb lengthening and deformity correction at the international center for limb lengthening in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Gdalevitch then embarked on her second fellowship in pediatric orthopedics and basic science research at the Children's Hospital at Westmead in Sydney, Australia. Earlier in her practice, she worked as an assistant professor of surgery at McGill University and at the Shriners Hospital in Montreal. Currently she works at Verdun hospital in Montreal, treating both children and adults for limb lengthening and deformity corrections.

Her clinical interests include: limb lengthening and deformity correction, osteogenesis imperfecta, hip reconstruction and pediatric orthopedics. Dr. Gdalevitch is currently pursuing research in bone regeneration research involving murine models of distraction osteogenesis well as disuse osteopenia models.
