SECOND ANNOUNCEMENT

The Rationale

Information is not synonymous with knowledge in our society today: information is external whereas knowledge is internal; information may lack meaning, whereas knowledge is always meaningful. It is specific to each person, emerging only after meaning has been attributed to information. One of the most important missions of education precisely consists in transforming information into knowledge.

The Society of Knowledge demands that the Education System undergoes a series of changes among which are the following:

- The necessary redefinition of learning: to learn is no longer simply 'knowing things', but now requires the ability to manage information, to confront new problems, and to design new methods of resolving them, ... it is to learn to make decisions about the work to be done.
- The necessary redefinition of the work teachers do: what is most important is the "learning", not the "teaching"; the protagonist of the activity must be the student, because it is the student who must make the information his/her own and transform it into knowledge that is meaningful and functional. Encouraging intellectual habits is one of the keys to achieving this and therein lies one of the major challenges for the education system today.
- The necessary change of the student from spectator to protagonist, from a subject who is acted upon to an agent who does the acting, and the consequent change of the teacher from actor to advisor and guide, from deliverer of information to counselor, thus transferring to the student the protagonism that is rightfully his/hers.

The establishment of New Technologies and their ordinary integration into teaching and learning will make these changes possible; not because they facilitate fast access to information, but because they require teachers and students to assume different roles and to no longer treat information in a linear fashion in order to allow for diverse ways for its structuring.

This 9th Conference of the European Council for High Ability should serve as the groundwork for a profound analysis of these issues, to come to know the latest advances and possibilities in New Technologies, and to evaluate the ongoing research in this field. Educational Technology is not only for the education of the gifted, but rather, serves the more ambitious purpose of helping to provide a gifted education for everyone: this is our commitment and our challenge.

Half-Day Tour in Pamplona Saturday, September 11, 2004

09:30

Departure from the Conference hotels to a visit in Pamplona. The visit will commence with a panoramic bus tour of the modern zone of the City, including: Yamaguchi Park & Planetarium, the University of Navarra and medical campus, and the "Ensanche" (the new "enlargement" of Pamplona). Next, continue to a visit of the Ciudadela ("Military Citadel") and the park surrounding it ("La Vuelta del Castillo"). It is a grand military structure, in the shape of a five-pointed star that today is a green belt and park for the use of the city's residents and visitors.

Next, travel to the **Plaza del Castillo**, the center of "Old Town", for a walking tour, which begins with the theme of the "**Running of the Bulls**" and the **Festival of Saint Fermin** including a visit to the **Plaza de Toros** the "bullfighting arena" (if open) and strolling down the famous **Estafeta Street**. Then, the tour will ascend to the **Cathedral**, which rests on the highest part of the City. Visiting the church, its cloister, and the Diocesan Museum, as well as a great viewpoint on the city. Continue walking through the history of Pamplona and the route that leads travelers down the ancient pilgrimage trail to Santiago de Compostela.

Arrive at the **Ayuntamiento** ("Town Hall"), a baroque façade structure that was constructed in 1756, and is known throughout the world as the launch-site for the famous "rocket", which marks the beginning of the nine-day Festival of Saint Fermin. Nearby, is the "**Church of Saint Saturnino**", a charming example of XIII century craftsmanship, with a grand baroque chapel dedicated to the patron saint of Pamplona, Virgen del Camino.

Half-Day Tour to Olite

Monday, September 13, 2004

09:30

Departure from the Conference hotels to a visit to Olite. Olite was the capital of the kingdom of Navarra. It keeps the medieval structure with narrow streets, stone houses and two important churches. The church of Santa María was built in gothic style and it has a great façade from the XIII century. The church of San Pedro was started to be built in Romanesque style and it has a Romanesque cloister and an original gothic tower. Continue to a visit to the castle of Olite. The castle-palace of Olite is the result of different constructive moments. The oldest part is from the XIII century and today is used as a Parador (Hotel). The palace was built during the kingdom of Charles the III, at the end of the XIV century and beginning of the XV.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Venue

The Conference will be hosted by the University of Navarra, which was founded in 1952 by the Saint Josemaría Escrivá de Balaguer. The University is a Corporate Work of Opus Dei (a personal prelature of the Catholic Church). The University offers 27 official degrees and over 300 postgraduate programs. With more than 16.000 students, 2449 professors, 577 research assistants and 152 doctoral dissertations in the last academic year, the University is considered one of the best universities in Spain according to quality criteria used in recent evaluation studies. In addition to the main campus in Pamplona, it has business schools in Madrid and Barcelona and a Secretarial College and Engineering School in San Sebastian. The University of Navarra also has a University Hospital, which employs around 1,700 professionals and provides treatment for over 100,000 patients every year.

Pamplona, Capital City of Navarra

Navarra is a world of sensations. Its nature, its history, the traditions and the socio-cultural events of this ancient autonomous community have made Navarra a destination that presents a unique mixture of impressions and emotions.

Pamplona, capital of the Ancient Kingdom of Navarra, is internationally known thanks to the Fiesta of San Fermín and its Bull Run. Since the foundation of Pamplona by the Romans in 75 BC, several cultures have left a rich legacy in the city. The city blends tradition and modernity in perfect harmony. The old part of the city, built in the middle ages is still surrounded by the city walls. The nearby citadel is now a public park and venue for exhibitions. Pamplona enjoys a high quality of life and modern services.

Language

The Conference official language is English, including lectures and printed material. Certain lectures by invited speakers and symposia will be held in Spanish. Details will be published in the Scientific Program.

The shields on the façades of the houses show the noble origin of the people of this valley, recognized by the king in the XV century. Drive from Pamplona with a stop at the **Mirador Del Baztán** for a beautiful view of the valley. Continue to a visit to **Zugarramurdi**, a Cave where the witches celebrated their Akelarres (parties). Then visit to **Elizondo** and a break for lunch. Elizondo is the capital and the commercial centre of the valley. There it is possible to see typical Basque houses and "Indiano" style, which were built by the people who returned from America. Proceed to a visit to the **Natural Park Of Bertiz** more than 2.000 hectares of beech trees, oaks and chestnuts. The area we visit is an exotic garden with 120 kinds of trees, which is situated on the lowest part, by the Bidasoa River. The garden has waterfalls, artificial lakes and nesting birds. Return to Pamplona and overnight in your chosen hotel.

Tuesday, September 7, 2004

Wednesday, September 8, 2004

Departure from Pamplona and a stop in **Alto del Perdón** for a panoramic view of Navarra area, the Pillgrims' road and the monument for their honor. Then continue to **Estella**, a town placed in the Pilgrims Way to Santiago, visiting **old Franks quarter** including the **old Town Hall** (XVII century); the **Kings' Palace** (XII century), the **Church of San Pedro de la Rúa**, the **Church of San Miguel Arcángel** (XII – XVI centuries) and **Santo Sepulcro Church** (XIII century). Continue to a visit to **Puente la Reina**, the imposing Romanesque seven-span bridge (XI century) and town, whose importance is due to being at a crossroads on the Pilgrims' Way. Puente la Reina has two important churches: the **Church of Santiago el Mayor** with its Romanesque facade, Barroque tower and French Gothic images in its interior; and the **Church of the Crucifix** founded by the Templar in the XII century. The main street (Calle Mayor) is a good example of the Jacobean architecture. Proceed to a visit to the **Church of Santa María de Eunate**, a small octagonal church built in the XII century placed in the Pilgrims' way to Santiago, and stands alone in a beautiful scenery of opened and flat land. Return to Pamplona and overnight in your chosen hotel.

Departure to a visit to **the Valley of Baztán**, which is in the nordest part of Navarra. The shields on the façades of the houses show the noble origin of the people of this valley, recognized by the king in the XV century. Drive from Pamplona with a stop at the **Mirador Del Baztán** for a beautiful view of the valley. Continue to a visit to **Zugarramurdi**, a Cave where the witches celebrated their Akelarres (parties). Then a visit to **Elizondo** and a break for lunch. Tuesday, September 14, 2004

Departing Pamplona for a visit to Saint Jean de Luz (France). This town is well known for its typical houses and its fishing port, which was very important in the IX century for whale and cod fishing in Terra Nova. During our visit we will see the city defence-walls, the fishing port and the city center. Continue on to the old town called Fuenterrabia.
