Gil Yosipovitch, MD

Gil Yosipovitch, MD is founding chair and Director of the Temple Itch Center at Temple University Medical School in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Dr. Yosipovitch was previously Professor of Dermatology, Neurobiology, Anatomy and Regenerative Medicine at the Wake Forest University School of Medicine in Winston-Salem, NC. Dr. Yosipovitch received his medical degree at the Sackler Faculty of Medicine Tel-Aviv University Israel in 1990 and completed internal medicine and dermatology residencies in Beilinson Medical Center which is affiliated with Sackler Faculty of Medicine. In 1995, Dr. Yosipovitch completed a dermatology fellowship on skin physiology at the Department of Dermatology at UCSF Medical Center in San Francisco, CA. From 1999-2002, he served as a consultant dermatologist in the National Skin Center in Singapore after which time he joined the faculty at Wake Forest University.

Dr Yosipovitch's major clinical interest is skin in systemic disease and pruritus. His research studies focus on neurophysiology of itch, pharmacology of anti- pruritics, and studying skin physiology using skin bioengineering techniques. He has published more than 250 articles in books and peer reviewed journals. In 2001, Dr. Yosipovitch organized the first International Workshop for the Study of Itch in Singapore. He is the founder and past president of the International Forum for The Study of Itch (IFSI).

Dr. Yosipovitch's NIH funded research is on brain mechanisms of itch and scratch. Dr. Yosipovitch has been awarded several prestigious awards for his research including The Rotschild Foundation Award for Young Investigators (1993) and the Heinz Maurer Prize for Dermatological Research by the German Dermatology Society (1998). Dr. Yosipovitch was awarded the Clinical investigator Award and the Friends of Students Award for Teacher of the year both at Wake Forest School of Medicine (2012). In 2013, at the World Congress of Itch in Boston, Dr. Yosipovitch was awarded the First Bienennial Bernhard Distinguished Lecture for his contributions for the clinical study of itch. In 2016 Dr Yosipovitch was the recipient of the Marion
